**Previous Council Review Date:**

**Summary:** Park Board duties are established by Pacific Municipal Code Chapter 2.38.050 Powers and Duties; and 2.38.050 (D) provides that the Board shall perform such other services and studies as may be requested by the City Council.

Earth Day Event, Resolution No. 15-228: To engage the community with their parks, open space and trails, the Park Board has co-sponsored, with other organizations such as Friends of the Lower White River and Pacific Partnerships, an annual Earth Day (April 22<sup>nd</sup>) event for many years. This year's Earth Day Network theme is "It's Our Turn to Lead." Pacific's event is still being planned. Suggestions include park clean up, recycling/trash drop off, a lunch, and other activities to involve all members of the community. It is scheduled for April 25, 2015.

Pacific Days Event, Resolution No. 15-229: Pacific Partnerships has annually hosted "Pacific Days" for several years. This event provides community building, tourism and participation in the City Parks. The Park Board would like to co-sponsor 2015 events with Pacific Partnerships in Pacific City Park. **Previous Council Review Date:**

**Summary:** The City of Pacific Council previously authorized expenditures in the amount of \$2,941,126.61 with ICON Materials for Stewart Road / Thornton Avenue Improvements Project, Bid No. TR0903 for roadway reconstruction per plans and specifications developed by Skillings Connolly. The City of Pacific has authorized Change Order No. 1 – 5 in the amount of \$158,235.63 increasing the contract to \$3,099,362.24.

The contractor has performed a value engineering analysis and a review of the Stewart Road /Thornton Avenue Improvements Project, specifically the following roadway cross sections:

Stewart Road South Side Station 14+80± to Station 25+00±

Stewart Road South Side Station 25+00± to Station 29+91±

Thornton Avenue West Side Station 7+60± to Station 9+07±

which the plans and specifications call for approximately three feet of excavation below the pavement and base course material to be replaced with gravel borrow per Option A of Table 7 (page 13) of the *Geotechnical & Pavement Engineering Report* prepared by HWA Geosciences, Inc. The contractor proposes that the section be constructed per Option B of Table 7 (page 13) of the *Geotechnical & Pavement Engineering Report* prepared by HWA Geosciences, Inc.;

All materials and methods will comply with the approved project specifications with the change limited to the reduction in depth of excavation and the added TX5 Geogrid material as specified in the *Geotechnical & Pavement Engineering Report* prepared by HWA Geosciences, Inc.;

The proposed contractor change will reduce the cost of construction by approximately \$55,317.50. The contractor has proposed a savings split of 50% to the contractor and 50% to the city;

Thornton Avenue West Side Station 7+60± to Station 9+07±

Be constructed per Option B of Table 7 (page 13) of the *Geotechnical & Pavement Engineering Report* prepared by HWA Geosciences, Inc.;

**WHEREAS**, all materials and methods will comply with the approved project specifications with the change limited to the reduction in depth of excavation and the added TX5 Geogrid material as specified in the *Geotechnical & Pavement Engineering Report* prepared by HWA Geosciences, Inc.;

**WHEREAS**, the proposed contractor change will reduce the cost of construction by approximately \$55,317.50;

**WHEREAS**, the contractor has proposed a savings split of 50% to the contractor and 50% to the city;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PACIFIC, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Pacific City Council hereby authorizes Change Order No. 6 to the Stewart Road/Thornton Avenue Improvement Project, which will reduce expenditures with ICON Materials for the placement of an engineered geo-grid fabric and reduction of over-excavation, resulting in in cost savings of approximately \$55,317.50, to be shared equally between the contractor and the City resulting in a reduction in to the contract in the amount of \$27,658.75, decreasing the contract amount to \$ 3,071,703.49.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force upon passage and signatures hereon.








TYPICAL ROADWAY SECTION (THORNTON AVE. STA 7+60 TO 9+07)

**Background:**

The contractor (Icon Materials) has provided a Value Engineering Change Proposal (VECP) to the City of Pacific to reduce the depth of the paving section for the project. Total savings to the project based on the contractor's proposal will be approximately \$55,317.50.

**Description of Change:**

The Geotechnical Report (HWA Geosciences) provided an alternate pavement design titled "Option B". Option B is a reduced section compared to the originally selected "Option A", and included a geogrid within the CSBC and Gravel Borrow sections. Option B will reduce the depth of excavation by 1'-6" and reduce the height of Gravel Borrow by 1'-6".

**Working Days:**

Three working days are subtracted from the contract time.

**Measurement and Payment**

Measurement and payment for this work will be by original and new Bid Item pricing as per the Summary of Quantities below. The Bid Item price will be full compensation for all costs associated with all labor, equipment, incidental material, haul, tools, incidentals, subcontractor and service provider mark-up, overhead and profit required to furnish, install, and successfully complete for all work.

The pavement recommendations presented in this report are based on these traffic calculations. If additional traffic count information is obtained that varies appreciably from these values, the recommendations given in this report should be reviewed and revised as necessary.

#### **4.2.2 New Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) Pavement Structure**

For new pavement design, a subgrade resilient modulus of 2.5 ksi was used. This value represents the subgrade soils conditions below the gravel shoulder of the road in the area to be widened (based on information obtained from the boreholes).

Unless some mitigation of future settlement is implemented, some future ongoing settlements of the pavement system should be anticipated due to consolidation of the peat layer under the weight of the new pavement structure and fill soils.

Tables 6 and 7 provide our HMA design recommendations for 20-year and 30-year designs, respectively, assuming the traffic loading input described above. Both designs present unreinforced pavement design and a reinforced section using two layers of Tensar® TX5 geogrid. All HMA pavement designs are based on the design method given in the 1993 AASHTO Design Guide (AASHTO, 1993) using the following parameters:

- Reliability = 90%
- Initial Serviceability = 4.2
- Terminal Serviceability = 2.5
- Overall Standard Deviation = 0.45
- Subgrade Resilient Modulus = 2.5 ksi

These values result in a required AASHTO Structural Number (SN) of 7.2 for the 20-year design and a SN of 7.7 for the 30-year design.

We recommend that the upper 3 inches of asphaltic surface layer consist of HMA Class ½-inch. The asphaltic layers below should consist of HMA Class 1-inch. The maximum lift thickness for HMA Class ½-inch is 0.3 feet (or 3.6 inches). The maximum lift thickness for HMA Class 1-inch is 0.35 feet (or 4.2 inches). These maximum lift thicknesses are stipulated by WSDOT (WSDOT, 2010).

Consideration could also be given to using the HMA millings material, mixed with crushed surfacing base course, as base course for the new pavement section, as specified in Section 9-03.21 of the WSDOT *Standard Specifications* (WSDOT, 2010).

Where the geogrid is specified, Tensar® TX5 triaxial geogrid should be used. No substitutions are acceptable. As indicated, where geogrid is specified, one layer shall be placed over the entire subgrade prior to placement of gravel borrow. Also, one layer shall be placed in the CSBC, at a depth of 14 inches from the top of the HMA. All manufacturers' recommendations for placement of grid shall be followed.

Recommendations are presented in Sections 4.4.1 and 4.4.2 for subgrade preparation and structural fill placement and compaction.

#### **4.2.3 HMA Overlay Design for Existing Pavement**

The existing pavement is typically comprised of about 6 to 8 inches of HMA over 2 to 3 inches of CSTC over variable thickness of granular fill material with considerable amount of cobbles. The existing pavement is in fair to poor condition, with areas of alligator cracking, longitudinal cracking and transverse cracking. All areas exhibiting alligator cracking should be identified and reconstructed prior to placement of an HMA overlay. The pavement design sections presented in Section 4.2.2 should be used for areas to be reconstructed. The FWD testing indicated that the existing pavement structure is relatively strong, with an average maximum deflection (normalized to a 9,000-pound load) of about 16 mils in the eastbound direction and 13 mils in the westbound direction. As indicated in Table 3 (Section 3.5), the average existing AASHTO SN is about 5.1 to 5.2 with a standard deviation of 1.4 and 1.2. For overlay design, we have used an existing AASHTO SN of 4 (average minus standard deviation for WB lane). We recommend that 1 inch of the existing HMA be milled prior to construction of the overlay, in order to provide better bonding for the new overlay.

Assuming 1 inch of HMA is ground from the existing pavement surface and a structural coefficient of 0.3 is used for the existing HMA, a SN of 3.7 is calculated.

For a 20-year pavement design, using the backcalculated resilient moduli determined from FWD testing, a structural number of 5.2 is required. Assuming a structural coefficient of 0.39 for new HMA, an overlay thickness of 4 inches is required.

For a 30-year pavement design, using the backcalculated resilient moduli determined from FWD testing, a structural number of 5.6 is required. Assuming a structural coefficient of 0.39 for new HMA, an overlay thickness of 5 inches is required.

We recommend that the overlay consist of HMA Class ½-inch. All cracks ¼ inch and larger observed in the pavement surface after milling should be cleaned (air-blasted) and sealed prior to placement of the overlay. A tack coat should be applied to the milled pavement surface prior to overlay.


