Re: Transportation Citizen Advisory Committee (TCAC)

The City of Pacific is seeking stakeholders to participate in a Transportation Citizen Advisory Committee (TCAC). The TCAC is made up of one City Councilmember from the Public Works committee, the Public Works Manager, and three to five stakeholders of the City. The Stakeholders shall be property owners that are residents or business owners.

The function of the Committee is to assist in the development of the annual Six-year Transportation Improvement System Plan (STIP). The Committee's functions include the following:

- Advise the City on transportation/traffic system issues, policies, standards, plans, and capital programs;
- Guide transportation system planning work and public involvement in transportation programs; and
- Set goals for the STIP and special transportation studies.

Meetings will be scheduled to occur once every three or four months with an additional meeting in May to finalize the STIP. However, there may be a few extra meetings at the offset to help people get started on the process.

Candidates will be selected based on ensuring that it is representative of a diversity of community members that includes neighborhood, technical, and business perspectives. The Mayor or City Administrator will select and appoint a small number of candidates based on a combination of the following qualifications:

- Knowledge or interest in transportation issues;
- Familiarity with City transportation system;
- An interest in the public policy issues affecting government activities.
- Ability to represent Pacific neighborhoods and/or business perspectives.
