



## MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

**Project Name:** Stewart Rd Improvements and Stewart Rd Bridge Replacement

**Permit Application No:** PLN-2020-0036

**Location:** Stewart Rd SE/8<sup>th</sup> St E from Valentine Ave SE to 140<sup>th</sup> Ave Ct E spanning the City of Sumner and City of Pacific. Township 20 North, Range 4 East, Section 1.

**Description of Proposal:** This project is using phased review under WAC 197-11-060 (5). The work will be completed in two phases. Stewart Rd Improvements is scheduled to begin 2021 and include work at Stewart Rd SE from Valentine Ave SE to the easterly edge of Butte Avenue SE. Work will include widening the existing road from 2 lanes to 4-5 lanes, construction of curb, gutter, sidewalks, planter strips, illumination, signalization and a center median. The project will include driveway improvements on adjacent properties along Butte Ave SE north of the intersection. Stewart Rd Bridge Replacement is scheduled to begin in 2023 and will occur from the easterly edge of Butte Avenue SE to 140th St Ct E. Work will include replacement of the existing 2 lane concrete tee beam bridge across the White River. The existing bridge will be replaced with a 4-lane standard pre-cast concrete girder bridge with a shared use path and a sidewalk.



### SEPA MITIGATION MEASURES

- 1) Opportunity shall be provided for the Tribes to review and comment on final design of the phase II bridge replacement project and its associated habitat management plan during the bridge replacement project shoreline permit.
- 2) Development within shoreline jurisdiction shall receive approval of necessary shoreline permits prior to development permit issuance for work in shoreline jurisdiction.
- 3) Each phase of the project shall include a habitat management plan for review and approval, addressing project impacts to shoreline and critical areas.
- 4) The footprint of any development proposed within the floodway and or floodplain shall provide analysis consistent with SMC 15.52, SMC 16.40 and SMC 16.56.
- 5) In the event that archaeological materials are encountered during the development of the property, an archaeologist shall immediately be notified and work halted in the vicinity of the find until the materials can be inspected and assessed. At that time, the appropriate persons are to be notified of the exact nature and extent of the resource so that measures can be taken to secure them. In the event of inadvertently discovered human remains or indeterminate bones, pursuant to RCW 68.50.645, all work must stop immediately and law enforcement should be contacted. Any remains should be covered and secured against further disturbance, and communication established with local police, the DAHP, and any concerned tribal agencies.
